



Testbourne Community School

The school holds an anaphylaxis pack, with antihistamines & x2 emergency spare 0.3 mg AAls (currently EpiPen) for students who have been prescribed one – intended for **emergency use only**.

Our policy requires that parents ensure their child always has their own prescribed & in-date AAI, including any other required allergy treatment with them at school. If your child forgets or loses their AAI, we can provide access to our spare in the event of an emergency - but **only with parental consent**.

Students must take their Adrenaline Auto Injector with them on school trips.

Please ensure that the school have an up-to-date copy of your child's allergy action plan to ensure proper care. If you do not have a current copy of the action plan, please arrange for it to be completed by your child's GP.
