How do we assess in Personal Development?

Self-assessment 'I Can' statements are used for Year 7 and Year 8 with their My Positive Start and My Body and Mind topics: this is so students are able to reflect on their own knowledge to develop their understanding of the some of the sensitive topics that have been taught.

Written assessments are used for all year groups: this will consist of ten questions that are then self-marked afterwards.

Group presentation assessments are used just for Year 9 and Year 10 with their My World topics. For Year 9, this will consist of the Active Citizen project that they will work on in groups. For Year 10, they will be participating in a Political Party race where they will then present to their peers, and we will hold a vote.

Speaking and Listening assessments are used for all year groups. This will consist of a speech and they will be assessed on their oracy skills, the content of the speech and the techniques used.
