Learn from them. Explore many experimentations – the more you do the more choice you have. Practise makes perfect! Write your thoughts on how successful, problems you come across	Make skilful art – practise makes perfect! Writing your thoughts through opinions, annotations and evaluations show the examiner what you are thinking as an artist. Justify yourself as a photographer.
